

Massachusetts General Hospital Global Health Finish Line Grant Proposal

The purpose of the MGH Global Health Finish Line Grant (GHFLG) is to promote the advancement of junior investigators/trainees from [MGH Global Health](#) faculty partner sites, who have a project that is near completion and requires funding to bring the project “over the finish line.” The aim of this award is to serve as a catalyst for the completion of these projects and support mentorship between MGH Global Health faculty and junior investigators/trainees.

GHFLG’s can range from \$500-\$2,500 per award each year.

The finish line grant funds can be utilized for:

- Protected time
- Childcare support
- Publication costs
- Administrative support to facilitate the submission
- Other (please describe)

Proposals for the grant should be limited to 1 page and include the following:

- Title of project that is near completion and associated researchers
- Description of the project
- Description of the funds requested and how these funds will help you complete your project
- Identified MGH Global Health faculty mentor*

*Global Health mentors should provide a few sentences on how they will support the completion of this project. These mentors do not need to be a part of the project but should provide support to help get it over the “finish line.” The number of awards per mentor per year will be limited based on resources.

Eligibility: Pre-tenured junior investigators/trainees from lower middle-income countries who are working on a project that is near completion. Applicants must identify a MGH Global Health faculty mentor.

Grants will be awarded on a rolling basis and will be reviewed by the Global Health Research Collaborative Steering Committee. Please submit proposal materials to Lindsey Garrison at legarrison@mgh.harvard.edu.
