## Safety and Security

- Update regarding Marburg update – discharged last patient on 11/8. Successfully traced all the contacts in the incubation period.
- If no new cases, can declare the outbreak over
- If you are traveling back from Kigali, refueling stop – should respond to questions as such and should not be rerouted

## Global Disaster Response

- Were in North Carolina for a couple weeks for hurricane disaster response
- Emergency meeting for U.S./Mexico border partners
- Updates on work in the middle east –
  - Met with Palestinian Red Crest Society while in Abu Dhabi
  - Will be able to start sending in faculty and instructors to do emergency capacity work in Hebron
  - Gaza is at a pause as they are letting in few humanitarian action forces. Focusing on the West Bank
  - Ukraine – educational work has ended and have a concept note into the WHO into how they can use the nursing training they established there to be part of the statewide continuing professional development

## Global Health Collaborative, Uganda

- Last week had Dr. Louise Ivers visit with Dr. Peter Olds.
- Dr. Ivers gave a talk on Global Health Equity with the Department of Internal Medicine. Looking at what Global Health Equity is and how it is achieved
- Had First Mile stakeholders meeting, one of the grant supporting the hospital and university
- 11/12/24 had Research Program
  - HOPENet was rated as one of the best research programs creating impact by one of the community advisory board members
